

k**NO**w**VAW**data Online Training Program Overview November 2022

The kNOwVAWdata initiative and its flagship kNOwVAWdata course (face-to-face and online) are funded by the generous support from the Australian Government through the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) for Asia and the Pacific region. The kNOwVAWdata course includes pathways to support regional adaptation, twinning and mentorship partnerships to measure VAW prevalence and facilitate evidence-informed programming to address violence against women. Building on the global interest, DFAT has generously encouraged adaptation and twinning partnerships outside Asia and the Pacific region as part of UNFPA's efforts to globalise the kNOwVAWdata Initiative. As a result, the course is currently being translated into several languages and adapted for multiple cultural contexts.
