Supporting Resource 2f: Recommended minimum data set for Administrative GBV data collection



A foundation for promoting the production and compilation of VAW administrative data at the **national** level.

- It is not an exhaustive list
- This list summarizes the most essential indicators to describe the service use and potential needs of VAW survivors
- This list does not limit collection of additional indicators relevant for the context
- There may be additional essential programme and policy-relevant indicators that are equally important to collect.
- The approach taken here is to focus on a minimum data set that would be relevant across sectors.

Type of violence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical • Sexual • Emotional/ psychological • Date reported violence occurred • Geographical reference: where violence occurred (e.g., city/village, sub-national if relevant, e.g., state, province) • Location of event: e.g., home, school, work, public space • Identify if violence was perpetrated using a computer (cybercrime) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sex • Age (life stage if age is unknown) • Survivor-perpetrator relationship 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sex* as reported by the survivor • Age* as reported by the survivor (life stage if age is unknown) • Does the service provider/administrative system have contact with the perpetrator • Actual age of the perpetrator (if known) • Actual sex of the perpetrator (if known) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Date of registry of violence with the organisation • Registering entity/person and their sector (if service provider) • Response or services provided (yes/no/not applicable/survivor declined/survivor decided to come back later) • Referral (yes/no/not applicable/survivor declined/referral to which services)

* Perpetrators can misrepresent their age and sex in order to build rapport with victim/survivors and may be part of grooming behaviour
